Start:Stop Reflections during Lent

Our Start:Stop Tuesday morning reflections offer busy commuters the chance to start their day by stopping to reflect for ten minutes. Reflections begin at 7.45am and repeat every quarter of an hour. The last reflection begins at 9am.

During Lent our reflections will be based on the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent Book; *The Merciful Humility of God.* The author, Dr Jane Williams, invites us to start Lent not in the desert but by a river – the river of Jesus's baptism – and calls on us to uncover the underground stream of God's love in our lives.

Lord, we pray that we may begin each day in the knowledge that we are your children and are beloved. Surround us with the waters of our baptism, a river of mercy, source of life and love.

May the mystery of this river bring hope to those in the deserts of despair and from the long droughts of the mind.

May the gift of your unfailing love, through your grace, continually sustain us.

On 5th February we welcomed our patrons, The Worshipful Company of Grocers, for a special service for Candlemas. Candlemas commemorates the presentation of Jesus in the Temple. During the singing of the Nunc Dimittis - the words of St Simeon after he had seen Jesus - the Master led a procession around the church.
